.... From Generation to Generation!

There's an old saying that goes, "We always stand on the shoulders of those who went before us." And it's true – whether you're talking about the field of medicine, science, technology, and aeronautics or whether you're talking about St. Michael ministry – we build on the sacrifices and advancements of others.

If you retrace the history of St. Michael you can see how people of vision seized opportunities that served to lay a foundation and then added on to that layer by layer. Let me share just a couple of examples to show you what I mean:

- Rev. Hugo Hartmann of Delray Beach along with 38 young adults (Walther Leaguers) from Tampa, Lakeland, Miami, Ft. Lauderdale & Delray Beach canvassed Ft. Myers making 800 calls to breathe life into this mission.
- 14 families joined together in 1941 to purchase the NW lot on Lafayette and Grand where a small church was built for \$5,500. A loan of \$4,000 was secured and a small parsonage was built the following year.
- 12 years later 6 lots were purchased on McGregor Blvd & Coconut for \$7,500 and a chapel & parish hall built for \$31,000. (A \$15,000 loan, \$10,000 grant, and \$6,000 from member gifts and pledges covered the construction costs).
- In 1956 St. Michael Lutheran School began with a kindergarten class with 20 children and 2 teachers. A monetary gift from one family made this opportunity financially possible.
- In 1958 and 1961 the education building was expanded. The 1st phase cost of \$14,000 was completely paid for by gifts and pledges. The 2nd phase cost of \$23,000 was made possible with a loan from Aid Association for Lutherans.
- In 1965 5 acres were purchased on Broadway and Carrell for \$25,000. The sanctuary was built in 1968 and the education building in 1978 (again using a combination of gifts, pledges and loans).
- In 1994 146 donors contributed \$1,937,109 and \$1,800,000 construction loan was secured to build the Anderson/Eichler athletic/fine arts building, renovate the science & computer labs, create an art room, and buy 5 lots on Spanish court to provide for our athletic field.

Now we stand at another cross road! An opportunity called "**Imagine**" is before us. Now our generation can complete this campus, build another layer, and provide for future generations:

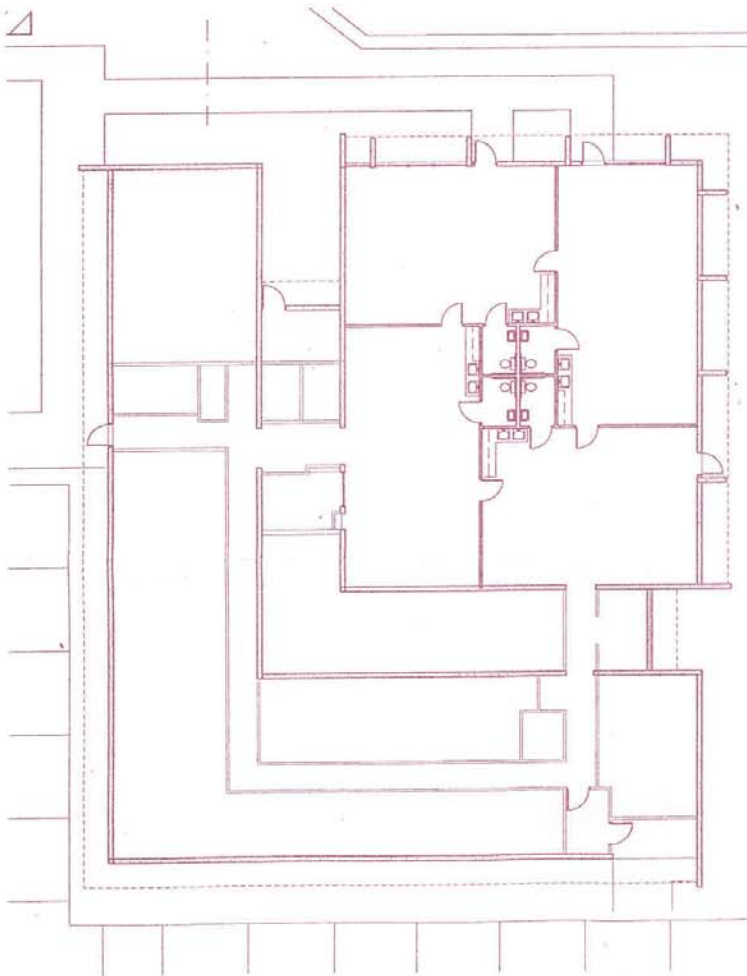
- (1) An early child education building for Pk3 & 4's (formally known as the Kidney Center – it's land, facility, and Spanish Court as our private drive).
- (2) An information center providing a bookstore, library/media center space, production studio, distance learning center, and 2 large halls for children, youth, and adult ministries.
- (3) Sanctuary renovation that will brighten the interior of God's house – new carpet, upholstery, stain glass windows, & a copula.
- (4) Debt reduction and the purchase of the final 2 lots on Spanish Court.

Like those who have gone before us, who have blessed us by their sacrifice, vision and dedication – let us seize the day! For God is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or **imagine**, according to **His power** at work within **us!** To Him be glory forever and ever!
